

MONITORING <u>NEW STAFFING LAW</u>. In effect January 1, 2022. Governor delayed enforcement until March 31.



- The Commissioner of Health will establish regulations for standards related to nursing home minimum staffing levels.
 At a minimum, nursing home staffing standards would have to include 3.5 hours of nursing care per resident per day. Of this 3.5 hours at least 2.2 would need to be provided by nursing assistants and at least 1.1 would need to be provided by licensed practical nurses (LPNs) or registered nurses (RNs).
- Compliance shall be determined quarterly by comparing the daily average of the number of hours provided per resident, per day, using the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services payroll based journal and the facility's average daily census on a daily basis.
 No penalties will be assessed prior to April 1, 2022
- Each facility must post their required staffing levels.

Updated CMS Guidance on Visitation, Quarantine, and Testing

Ref: QSO-20-39-NH Revised: March 10, 2022

Masks:

- Residents, regardless of vaccination status, can choose not to wear face coverings or masks when other residents are not present and have close contact (including touch) with their visitor.
- Visitors should wear face coverings or masks and physically distance when around other residents or healthcare personnel, regardless of vaccination status.

• Testing:

- A resident who has been outside the facility has had a close contact with an individual with COVID-19, they should be tested for COVID-19, regardless of vaccination status. If unvaccinated should be in quarantine.
- Residents and staff with COVID-19 symptoms or who have had close contact with someone in the facility who tested positive must be tested immediately, regardless of vaccination status.

White House announces Nursing Home Reforms, February 28, 2022

"Despite the tens of billions of federal taxpayer dollars flowing to nursing homes each year, too many continue to provide poor, substandard care that leads to avoidable resident harm."

These critical reforms will address many of the long-standing problems that have plagued nursing homes for decades.

These are critically important reforms, and the nursing home industry is fighting back.

White House announces Nursing Home Reforms

- The <u>Biden Administration announced</u> it would be implementing a variety of nursing home reforms, including:
 - the creation of a minimum staffing standard in nursing homes (after study but will issue proposed rules within one year),
 - accountability for poor performing nursing homes,
 - increased transparency around ownership and finances, and
 - support for direct care staff.
