- · Applying for Medicaid is FREE.
- You don't need to provide a credit card.
- Medicare won't need your MEDICARE NUMBER.
- You never need to pay to continue benefits.

About your Medicare Card



- · Offers of a plastic Medicare card are scams.
- Medicare only offers and approves a paper card.
- If you get a call saying you qualify for a new card -HANG UP! Do not verify your Medicare number or other personal information.




