Session Overview

Rules related to long-term care, Medicaid and Medicare are constantly changing and may impact the ability of older persons and their families in planning for and obtaining needed services. Navigating those systems is challenging.

It is critical need for properly plan to deal with emergencies, hospitalization, and nursing home care. Many families often faced heartbreaking situations because critical health care proxy, HIPPA designation, or Power of Attorney paperwork was not in place or inaccurate.

In this session you will learn about:

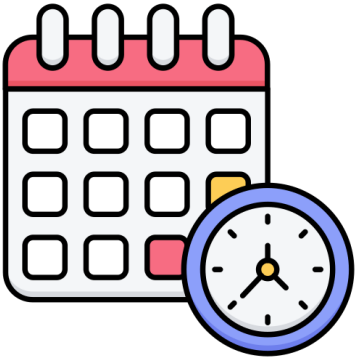
- Important Personal Planning documents.
