The ALICE Project is a collaboration of United Ways in Connecticut, Florida, Hawaii, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Texas, Virginia, Washington, and Wisconsin. United Way of New York will discuss the results of the data collected provided in the 2026 ALICE report.

In this session you will learn about:

- How the United Way ALICE Project provides a framework, language, and tools to measure and understand the struggles of the growing number of households in our communities that do not earn enough to afford basic necessities.
- The measures used by ALICE to present a more complete picture of economic stresses that are more accurate and useful than the federal poverty level data.
- How state and local organizations can use the data to get a clearer picture of poverty in our communities.
- Suggested steps for follow-up for community members, policy makers, non profits, and employers to help them better address the needs of residents who are economically stressed.
